## President's Message

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Dear Friends,

We held our first Zoom congregational meeting on May 17. There was more than a quorum and the meeting ran smoothly. Many thanks to Marley Banker and the technology team who made this happen and thanks to everyone for attending the meeting. In particular, we'd like to thank Allison Luzader for helping with outreach and Zoom training; Sarah Dilling for essential help monitoring the meeting & providing Marley with general support along the way; and Rick Wilson for his willingness to step into and learn a new way to moderate our meetings, his flexibility, and his grace.



At the meeting, Ryan presented a brief financial report. Our finances are slightly strained by the pandemic, in particular, we've lost our rental income. But we've gotten a PPP loan which is helping us, especially with our payroll. Members of the finance committee will be talking to congregants to find out if people need to adjust their pledges based on the economic downturn.

At the meeting, we elected new board members: Brian Flaherty, Bruce Hunt and Treela McKamey for three-year terms, and Catherine Crain for a two-year term. We elected Lily Eakin and Matt McGee to the Congregational Life Committee, and Dick Volkman to the Endowment Committee. Thanks to all these volunteers for taking on these responsibilities and serving our community!

The Board asked the congregation to approve up to \$175,000 for our roof repair project and they did. These funds will come partly from our reserves (approximately \$45,000) and the rest from member loans. We don't expect to spend this much. The roof bid itself is about \$55,000. But this bid doesn't include structural repairs, or sheet rock repair/replacement, or our consultant. As we've noted in the FAQs, we have some estimates for these amounts, but we've asked for more than we think we'll need. We want to make sure we are authorized to spend enough to get this roof fixed correctly.

Roof construction will have started by the time you receive this newsletter, if all goes according to plan. There are stringent health safeguards in place and anyone coming to the church property should be prepared for a construction site. Everyone should wear a mask. For safety reasons, we should not do gardening anywhere near the workers. We are expecting this project to take 1-2 months.

Another exciting project is our interim minister search. We are very happy to announce that a candidate has been identified. We are currently in contract negotiations and will announce the name of our new interim minister very soon, probably before you receive this newsletter.

The virus task force has proposed guidelines for use of the building during this phase of the pandemic and they are planning for future phases. The guidelines were sent out in an e-bulletin in May, but we'll repeat them below. Many thanks to the virus task force: Susan Storer Clark, Carol Jackson, Dana Doerksen, Eliza Sutton, Kristina Selset, Peggy Williams Scott, Richard Fenske, Rich Clark, Sarah Dilling, Rev. Amanda Aikman, Dianne Carreri, Brandon Hunter, and Chris Pollina.

Our first board meeting with the new Board of Trustees will take place on Wednesday, June 3 at 7:00. The link will be posted on the church web page and congregants are welcome to zoom in as observers.

## *Side by Side... a column from Mental Health & Recovery Ministries*

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As we go deeper together in this strange time of global pandemic I'm experiencing a renewed clarity about what matters most. We must take care of ourselves so we can help take care of our family and community...our neighbors. We risk everything by losing sight of the reality that we are all in this together. What effects one, effects all. There is the global and the personal perspectives to consider. The consequences of this pandemic on our bodies, minds and spirits are real and evident in the challenges we face every day. Many of us are facing an unusual level of exhaustion. Some struggle with difficulty concentrating. When we are so overwhelmed, we can lose our empathy and find ourselves feeling only numb.

Today, I want to invite you to spend some time thinking about how you care for yourself and avoid these difficult symptoms of living in times of stress and trauma. Please take care of your mental health. We can create daily rituals of self-care to survive and even grow through life's painful times.

The basics really matter here; eating plenty of vegetables, protein and fruit can give your body the nourishment it needs. Lots of water will help you avoid dehydration, which negatively effects mood, memory, attention and motor coordination. Walking, yoga, weight lifting, dancing or however you love to move your body, helps you in many ways including helping you sleep at night. Perhaps most importantly in these times, exercise boosts your immune function. The other wonderful way to boost immune function is to get plenty of sleep. If this is a challenge for you ask for help. Your doctor will be a good resource, but you can start by reading articles on sleep hygiene. We can learn how to help ourselves get a good night's sleep. Even if you aren't sleeping, leave enough time to rest.

Since we are more than our bodies, we also have to tend to our curiosity, creativity and our spirits. Learning new things has always been a mood booster for me. Try it! A good friend has started creating art out of found objects. Another friend sends me poems and pictures of her blooming garden nearly every day. It is a great joy to see many of your faces at our Zoom church gatherings. Most importantly, do something every day to create the world we want to see as we emerge from pandemic times. Educate yourself about big money in politics. Find a candidate who will help (instead of hurt) and work for her/him. Donate money if you have it. Talk to friends about what you are doing. These are things that can help us. Give it a try, because you and every person on this planet is worth it!

There was a general discussion around the feasibility and advisability of holding the May general meeting.

There has only been one person willing to be a new board member at this time, Bruce Hunt.

There have been several people who expressed interested prior to the COVID-19 outbreak and now have said they can't do it during the crisis. There may be an opportunity to approach them and have them reconsider.

The challenges of the mechanics of holding a meeting online with such a large number of people and providing them the ability to participate is concerning. Catherine has met with a large group of 19 UU Board presidents (that Tandi organized on Zoom) almost all of whom have said they plan on going ahead with their annual meetings online. We have also received some resources from the UUA about holding congregational meetings online during the crisis.

Our attorney, Chris Doerksen has stated that the zoom platform for a meeting is consistent with our bylaws and would avoid the problem of having an "unelected" board if we were to postpone the meeting.

**Decision: We will hold the May congregational meeting online. The scope of the May general meeting will include nominations and authorization to proceed with funding the repair of the roof.**

Motion to hold the church general meeting on May 17<sup>th</sup> online.

Marley moved. Susan seconded. Vote was unanimous.

**Action item: Catherine to approach Rick Wilson about willingness to moderate the meeting online.**

Financial report and outlook (Ryan)

Rental Outlook

There is an expectation of a steep drop-off in revenue from rentals as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak.

8. There was a general discussion around a proposed walkway (proposed by the City of Shoreline) to be built to support pedestrian traffic to the new light rail station. This walkway will impact church property.

The issue of the term the interim minister will serve for has been discussed with some members of the church desiring a 1-year term and others desiring a 2-year term. The UUA recommends a 2-year term. The search committee is recommending a 2-year term.

There was a request to bundle the proposed revisions to the bylaws (possibly with a proposed name change of the church to "Shoreline UU Congregation" for presentation at the December 2020 general meeting.
